### Form for Additional Footnote / Endnote Reference

Use a shorten form of the note consisting of the last name of the author and the main title (usually shortened if more than 4 words) for subsequent references to a particular source.	11. Kirkendall, Civil Liberties Legacy, 22.
Use "Ibid." only when a note refers to the work cited in the note immediately preceding.	12. Ibid., 33-37.
